World History/Geography

World history tells the stories of people, events, and institutions from the earliest civilizations to modern times. Focus will be placed on the beliefs of those in the past, the ways they met their economic needs, the social and political institutions they formed, and the culture they transmitted from one generation to another.

This course also integrates the teaching of Geography with History. Geography is not taught as a separate subject but is included in every lesson as needed, through maps, diagrams, photographs, and text descriptions.

<u>Class Materials</u>: Textbook, Notebook, Pen (**Blue or Black Ink Only**) or Pencil, and a Positive Attitude – **Needed Everyday!**

<u>Classroom Rules</u>: Be on time, be prepared, be respectful of everyone and everything, be on task, and recycle all paper.

Notebooks should **NEVER** be placed in your textbook. Cell phones are to be **turned off** and **placed upside down on the corner of your desk until the dismissal bell rings**. During tests or quizzes your phone must be placed on the floor, under your desk, upside down, and off. Any first offense violation will result in me keeping the phone until the end of the day. Second and any further offenses will be handled by the office. Remember backpacks and purses are not allowed in the classroom.

Beginning of Class: Class begins with the 2^{nd} Bell. If you are not in your seat promptly after the 2^{nd} bell, you are late. If you have any make-up slips they will be signed during this time. We will do an opening activity at the beginning of each class. These activities may range from discussing an article from the newspaper and current events, reviewing previously discussed concepts, or previewing the day's lesson.

<u>Participation</u>: You will receive a daily participation grade for your time in this class. You will earn your points as long as you are **prepared** and **actively** engaged in the learning of U.S. history. This means working on opening activities, note taking, participating in discussions, working on history homework, following classroom rules, having required class materials, etc. You will earn two points each day for a total of approximately **80 points** per quarter. No points will be awarded for unexcused absences, and you will lose points for being late to class. Participation points will be figured every two weeks. You'll be allowed one unexcused absence per grading period. After one unexcused absence you will receive an X in the grade book, meaning the points won't help you or hurt you.

Leaving the Room: Trips to your locker and restroom will be strictly limited. I will only allow you to use

Make-up Work: If you miss class it is your responsibility to come and see me. If you miss class and come to school later in the day you are expected to stop in and get your make-up work. <u>Late Work</u>: If you do not turn an assignment in when I collect homework, then the work is late. I will only accept late work the **next day** after the assignment is due. This will result in the loss of one letter grade. **Late work will NOT be accepted after the next day.**

<u>Class Grade</u>: Your grade in this class will be determined by scores on homework, tests, quizzes, papers, projects, and participation.

<u>Cheating</u>: Cheating and/or plagiarism will not be tolerated in this class. Turning in identical work to someone else on a nongroup project or assignment will be considered cheating. If caught cheating or plagiarizing you will receive a **zero** on that assignment.

<u>Test Taking:</u> When taking tests in my room all books, notebooks, etc. must be shoved under your desk. Nothing is to be in the aisles. All tests must be completed before the period is over unless otherwise notified, and there should be absolutely no talking during test time. On test days you should bring a book to read or something else to work on in case you finish early.
