while the 7th & 8th grade will maintain their previous years schedule. Some differences you will notice are that 6th grade will now be receiving a recess, where they would not have in the past; 5th graders will not spend the majority of their day in one classroom, but instead be departmentalized like a traditional middle school setting. Again, due to numbers, our 5th and 6th grades will each have band individually, and 7th & 8th grade will again combine for both Band and Choir. With a change of this nature, patience is key, we knew this transition would take some time for everyone to adjust, but this change will be best for our staff and students and is coming along nicely.

Middle School Pride Program

The Middle School Pride Program is in place to help Middle School students gain a measure of organization, responsibility, and self-discipline. Student progress is monitored weekly and notifications are communicated to parents when students go above the allotted weekly check goal (10). A student who receives more than 10 checks in a week will be required to serve a pride check detention the following week. Students who average less than 5 checks a week, per quarter, will be permitted to attend that quarters pride check activity. Our pride check activities are fun in nature and a great way to reward students for following our guidelines and modeling appropriate classroom behaviors.

The list provided will give you an idea of what actions a student may earn a check for during the school week.

When your child is ill or absent for any reason, we ask that you please call the Elementary/Middle School office by 9:00 a.m. the day of the absence to help us confirm attendance and make all necessary arrangements for your child's homework and schedule.

Our staff will do their best to have all assignments and activities listed, if not available for your child to complete at home, through our CANVAS learning site. If you wish to pick up textbooks, homework, or other necessary school equipment for your child the day he or she is absent, please again notify the office by 9:00 a.m.

*In the case of illness, students should have two days' time for the first day gone and one day for each day thereafter to make up their work. In the classroom you may get checks for:

- Incomplete, not done, or poorly done assignments - 1 check
- Disrupting the classroom and the learning of others - 1 check
- Using bad language, name calling, or harassing behavior - 1 check
- → Disrespectful behavior toward anyone 1 check
- → Not having normal classroom materials with you-Textbook, Notebook, Pen, or Pencil - 1 check
- → Improper care or use of materials and classroom equipment - 1 check
- → Chewing gum and candy 5 checks
- → Not having assignment book and keeping it up to date (5th & 6th grade only) - 1 check
- → You will receive double the checks if given by a substitute teacher
- → Tardy between classes 1 check
- → Tampering with equipment: Classmate's computer, Cables, Mice, Headphones, Cameras, or Microphones - 5 checks
- Repeated use of Internet without permission 3 checks
- → Playing games without permission 5 checks
- → Other infractions not listed are at the discretion of the teacher

Electronic devices must remain in student's' locker or backpacks at all times, unless specified by the classroom teacher. If a student is found using electronic devices during the school day without permission the following action(s) will take place:

- 1st Offense- Device will be taken for the remainder of the day
- 2nd Offense- Device will be taken for the remainder of the day. Parents will be notified and will have to come to the school to pick up the device.
- 3rd Offense- The student will not be allowed to have the device in school without Mr.
 Engleman's knowledge. When allowed, the device will remain in the office during the school day.
