
All new families should plan to register in person on Tuesday or Wednesday, July 21 or 22. If you know of a new family in our district, please forward this newsletter to them.

Online Registration Instructions

- From <u>www.centrallyon.org</u>, under Quicklinks, click on JMC Gradebook.
- 2. Click on the Parents Link.
- 3. Change the school year to 2020-21.
- 4. Log in with your username (your last name) and the password that you set up. If this is the first time logging in, your password is also your last name.
- 5. Click on the button labeled Register for 2020-2021.
- 6. There will be a registration dashboard. Click each item to complete registration.
- 7. To see if you qualify for Free and Reduced meals, click on Meal Application section during registration.
- 8. All payments for <u>fees</u> will now be made in JMC. We are no longer using our "Online Store" for these payments. Return to Learn with COVID-19

As you and your family prepare for the school year, I want everyone to know we continue to closely monitor guidance from public health officials and the Iowa Department of Education (IDOE). As of today, we are planning for students to return for inperson teaching and learning on Wednesday, August 19.



It is our belief that in-the-classroom learning is the best environment for our students' educational advancement and social-emotional well-being. But we acknowledge the concerns parents and staff have regarding the health and safety of students, families, and our community. You should know when students return in August, teachers and staff will review health and safety protocols to mitigate an outbreak of the coronavirus. These strategies include frequent handwashing, the use of hand sanitizer, covering coughs, limiting the touching of faces, and reducing physical contact with others while maintaining an appropriate social distance from each other. At this time, face coverings will be optional for students and staff.

While it is our plan for students to be "on-site" on August 19, we are anticipating there may be times during the year when we may need to limit access to school facilities. Our plan calls for

school leaders to collaborate with public health officials to determine if short-term closures are needed to prevent further spread of the virus within our community. In preparation for an extended closure, our Return to Learn Team continues to update and revise plans for distance learning, including a hybrid model of teaching and learning, which includes elements of on-site and distance learning. If public health and school leaders conclude there is a substantial outbreak of the coronavirus, students and staff will shift to distance learning or the hybrid model of teaching and learning.

It is our belief extracurricular and co-curricular activities are an important part of the school experience, and we remain hopeful these opportunities can be offered safely for our students. Currently the IDOE, Iowa High School Athletic Association (IHSAA), and Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union (IGHSAU) continue to develop guidance in collaboration with the Iowa Department of Public Health. Once we have received these recommendations, we will review them with our coaches, make plans for implementation, and communicate them to students and families.

We wanted to provide this update in full transparency of our best intentions for students and staff as we prepare for the school year. Follow-up communications will be provided in early August which will include additional information and detailed plans for building-specific procedures and activities. We appreciate your patience and support as we navigate these challenges and the ones that are sure to come. Our community partnership is essential as we continue to prepare for the school year. Student Immunization, Screenings & Health Form Requirements

The State of Iowa requires all students going to school in Iowa to have a Certificate of Immunization, a Provisional Certificate of Immunization, or a Certificate of Immunization Exemption at the beginning of the school year. Read on for specific requirements pertaining to grades and health conditions. All required forms can be found on Central Lyon's website > Health & Wellness > Forms/Requirements.



Health Requirements for School

- Kindergarten dental screening, vision screening, and the following immunizations: 5
 doses of DTap, 4 doses of Polio, 2 doses of MMR, 3 doses of Hepatitis B, and 2 doses of
 Varicella, or a valid exemption certificate
- 3rd Grade vision screening
- 7th Grade the following immunizations: 1 dose Tdap and 1 dose Meningitis

- 9th Grade dental Screening
- 12th Grade the following immunizations: 2 doses of Meningitis

Requirements for Students with Chronic Health Conditions

- A Medication Authorization Form is required if your child will be taking medication at school.
- An Asthma Action Plan and the Medication Authorization Form are required for children with asthma.
- If your child will be carrying their inhaler with them throughout the school day, the *Authorization to Carry Inhaler* is also required.
- A *Diet Modification Form* is required for students with a food allergy that requires modification for school meals.
- Food Allergy & Anaphylaxis Emergency Care Plan is for students with food allergies or other allergies that may cause an anaphylactic reaction.
- The Diabetes Medical Management Plan is required for students with diabetes.
- A Seizure Action Plan is required for students with epilepsy or other seizure disorder.

Again, these forms can be found on <u>Central Lyon's website > Health & Wellness > Forms/Requirements</u>.

Athletic Physicals & Concussion Forms

All athletes and cheerleaders in grades 7-12 are required to submit an Athletic Physical as well as a Concussion form PRIOR to the first day of practice. These forms are located in the Health & Wellness section of the website.

PLEASE NOTE: Students will not be able to attend school without meeting the immunization requirements and will not be allowed to participate in any school-related activities.

Student Drop-Off & Pick-Up Procedures

To promote student safety, the Central Lyon Community School District would like parents/guardians to use the Story Street elementary/middle school entrance for student drop-off between 7:45 and 8:10 a.m., and for student pick-up between 3:00 and 3:20 p.m. The west side entrance is not available for student pick up or drop off (these doors will be locked). All buses will continue to load and unload on the south side of the building in the designated bus loading zone. Click on the man for

Utilize Story Street from the North

• Each morning, families are asked to refrain from turning north on Story Street. This helps ease congestion and safety concerns for our students. Whether you are arriving from the east or west on 12th Avenue, please use Marshall Street to travel north. From 10th Avenue, families may enter Story Street heading south.

Drive & Drop

• Families are encouraged to utilize the Drive & Drop lane to the south of the Elementary/Middle School Office. Please pull forward as far as possible.

Drop Off Parking

• If you should need to accompany your student into the building, please use the parking spaces north of the Elementary/Middle School office.

Street Parking

• Parking on the east side of Story Street is reserved for residents.



Welcome Back from Mr. Harman

With the conclusion of the 2019-2020 school year occurring with students at home instead of the usual manner, many questions exist and remain for the start of the upcoming year. The Central Lyon Elementary staff would like all students, families, and the community to know that we will continue to educate students in the best fashion possible to meet the needs of each and every student.

Listed below are the initiatives for the following grade levels to help build success during the 2020-21 school year.

Preschool- 4th Grade

The 2020-21 school year will be the third year for Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) at Central Lyon Elementary. ROAR – Respect all, Offer help, Accept responsibility, and Reach expectations – will remain our focus for students. Teachers will continue to work with their classes and individual students to set achievable goals for appropriate behavior and positively reinforce them when our ROAR expectations are demonstrated.

Last year, I am happy to report, students made gains in reading based upon the FAST assessment. Thanks to the hard work of teachers and their use of our new reading curriculum, Into Reading, we hope to build upon the successes of 2019 during the 2020-21 school year. I am very excited to monitor our student's success with a full year of implementation.

Fifth and Sixth Grade

The 2020-21 school year will see students and teachers in the middle school begin their implementation of PBIS. Middle School Staff spent much of last year developing common expectations and a common vocabulary for use with students in 2020-21. It is important that each student understands these expectations, monitors their behavior, and implements a daily routine that promotes success during the school day. Families are encouraged to discuss the and utilize the expectations matrix at home to help their children experience high levels of comprehension and implementation. As principal, I am excited to monitor how the expectations and common vocabulary utilized with students will promote academic success throughout the school year.







Free & Reduced

The application for for free and reduced price meals is available in JMC during registration. Instructions may be found on the website under Parent Info > School Meals.

This must be completed annually.

Backpack Program

This is a special program that requires the return of the permission slip linked on the Central Lyon website under Parent Info > School Meals. A new slip must be turned in each year.

Annual Passes to Cover Athletics & Activities

Athletic and Activity Passes purchased for the 2020-21 school year will cover admission to **ALL EVENTS** sponsored by Central Lyon, with the exception of state competitions.

Activity tickets are required for students in grades 7-12 who participate in co-curricular activities, and optional for other students. A student athletic and activity pass allows the

student admission to all activities sponsored by Central Lyon, with the exception of state competitions.

Central Lyon also offers a family activity ticket option. The family ticket will cover two parents and all children in grades TK-6 for a cost of \$200. The family ticket does not cover students in grades 7-12. Please note: Family Athletic & Activity Passes do not qualify for the free or reduced fee program.

New for 2020-21

- Students in grades 7 and 8 will be served in the High School Commons/Lunchroom.
- A fruit and vegetable bar will be offered daily for students in grades 7-12, replacing our salad bar. This will allow students a bigger variety of fruits and vegetables to choose from.
- Due to recommendations from the FDA, there will be no cash transitions. As a result, there will likely be changes to the a la cart offering.
- Money may be deposited into lunch accounts online, or by bringing a check to the office.
 Low balance notices will be sent through email from JMC (or by phone or mail if email isn't available). Students with a negative lunch account of \$20 or more will be given an alternative cold lunch.

There's no doubt changes will continue to be made, but we will do whatever it takes to serve tasty and nutritious food options for all students in a friendly and efficient manner.
