CENTRAL LYON BOARD MINUTES

January 13, 2020

The Central Lyon Board of Directors met in regular session in the Board Room of the Central Lyon Community School at 7:00 P.M. with the following members present: President David Jans, Vice President Andy Koob, Directors Scott Postma and Joel DeWit, and Superintendent Brent Jorth and Board Secretary Jackie Wells. Other individuals present were Elementary Principal Steve Harman, MS/HS Principal and Activities Director Jason Engleman, Stephanie Baker, Michelle Van Wyhe, Michael Groen, Emily Deutsch and Jessica Jensen. Director Keri Davis was absent.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 P.M.

Koob moved to approve the agenda with additional bills presented and Postma seconded, carried 4-0.

Postma moved to approve additional agenda items including minutes of past meetings, the financial report through December 31, 2019 and the summary list of bills; Koob seconded, carried 4-0.

In recognition, Principal Steve Harman reported that four entities/individuals made donations to the hot lunch program to assist with family payments or past due accounts. The donations are to remain anonymous.

In correspondence, IASB's Regional Workshop: Leadership Essentials for School Boards will be held on February 20, 2020 from 5:30-8pm in Sheldon.

In reports, Principal Steve Harman reported that FAST testing will take place in January. Principal Jason Engleman reported that Kelly Weiler and Morgan McComas will split head and assistant coaching duties for softball again this season. Director Andy Koob reported the Central Lyon Foundation is finalizing details on a financial support project for the district. Additional details will be available at a future board meeting. Superintendent Brent Jorth reviewed upcoming board meeting and work session schedules and topics and asked members for input on ideas and opportunities. Mr. Jorth reviewed an upcoming IASB learning opportunity in February and asked members to consider attending.

In New Business, DeWit moved to approve the School Budget Review Committee (SBRC) application for Modified Supplemental Amount and Supplemental Aid for the 2020-2021 Dropout Prevention Program in the amount of \$239,480. The requested MSA and required match (and associated spending authority) is solely for the purpose of implementing the 2020-2021 at-risk and dropout prevention program plan as approved by the Central Lyon CSD School Board in December 2019. Postma seconded, carried 4-0.

Koob moved to approve the 1st reading of policies 104-104.R1, second reading required and policies 503-503.5, 402.2 and 403.7-403.7E1-E3, with no second reading required. DeWit seconded, carried 4-0.

In Personnel, Postma moved to approve the resignation of Amy DeBoer, Paraprofessional and the hiring of Amy Sprock, Co-Prom Advisor. DeWit seconded, carried 4-0.

The next regular board meeting will be at 7:00 P.M. on Monday, February 10, 2020 in the Central Lyon board room. DeWit moved to adjourn at 7:28 P.M. and Koob seconded, carried 4-0.

RE: Policy Revision: 504 Series & IASB 2nd Quarter Primer Updates &

It is recommend the Board approve the policies as submitted.

The Board may waive the 2nd reading.

Below is a summary, an addendum to the Board Packet has the policies as revised for review.

104 – Anti-Bullying/Anti-Harassment

104.R1 – Anti-Bullying/Anti-Harassment Regulation

These changes are designed to align the Anti-Bullying/Anti-Harassment policy with federal requirements from the U.S. Department of Education's Office of Civil Rights. The policy has been rewritten to more clearly apply the Anti-Bullying/Anti-Harassment policy to district employees and volunteers in addition to students. By incorporating employees and volunteers, this policy allows districts to apply one uniform grievance and investigation procedure to all individuals within the district. Applying one policy to everyone allows district employees and volunteers to lead their students by example as a workplace that models respect for one another. This policy and the accompanying regulation have been rewritten in their entirety to remove duplicative language.

302.7 – Superintendent Civic Activities

303.8 – Administrator Civic Activities

The language from these policies authorized the district to pay a lump sum for civic activities the superintendent/administrator may engage in. Previous policy language made payment of the lump sum contingent on the activity fulfilling a public purpose. This language has been removed from the policy because board policy must be enforced once it is adopted. There is no way for the district to enforce how employees spend their salary. Attempting to account for this would create an unnecessary burden on district staff and could be construed as intrusive to the district employee. The language is being removed from policy and is instead encouraged to be included in the superintendent's/administrator's contract.

404.R1 – Code of Professional Ethics Regulation

The text of this regulation has been replaced in its entirety due to updates in the administrative code.

415.1 Early Retirement Incentive – Classified Staff

NEW – recommended for adoption in February 2020 and to be rescinded in July 2020

An early retirement policy for classified staff based upon the criteria – 1) age of 61 and 2) 20 years of service to Central Lyon. The proposed incentive would be provided for two (2) years and total \$24,000 per employee.

504.1 Student Government

This policy outlines how the student council provides for student activities, serves as a training experience for student leaders, gives students a share in the management of the school, acts as a clearinghouse for student activities, seeks to interest students in school district affairs and helps solve problems that may arise.

504.2 Student Organizations

In order to better align with IASB, the current 504.1 and 504.A policies have been combined with 504.2 Student Organizations to make a new 504.2 Student Organizations.

This policy reflects the protection given non-school-sponsored student groups in the federal Equal Access Act. It defines the curriculum and non-curriculum based groups and how they will operate, including financial responsibly. In addition, it states that student athletes in grades 9-12 who want to participate in a non-school sport during the same school sport season must have written permission from the high school principal.

504.3 Student Publications

504.3R1 Student Publications Code

Students may produce official school publications as part of the curriculum under the supervision of a faculty advisor and the principal. Any expression made by students, including student expression in official school publications, is not an expression of official school policy. The production of official school publications is guided by the law and by the ethical standards adopted by professional associations or societies of journalism.

The regulation provides guidelines on what is allowed or permitted in a school district publication, as well as the responsibilities of the students and faculty advisor.

504.4 Student Performances

Students may perform in contests or other public and private events with proper permission and supervision. The events must be approved by the superintendent or his designee. If it involves unusual travel and expense, the board must approve of the performance.

504.5 Student Fundraising

Students may raise funds for school-sponsored events with the permission of the principal.

504.6 Student Activity Program

This is a mandatory policy that addresses the issue of non-school athletic participation.

504.7 Social Events

Because this policy no longer aligns with IASB, it is recommended that it is removed from policy and added to the Student Handbook.

504.8 Guidelines for Setting Admission Fees and Handling School Activity Passes

Another policy that does not align with IASB and should be placed in the Student Handbook.

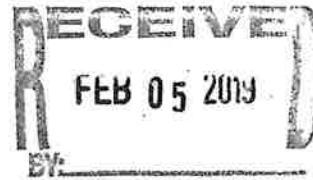
504.9 Class Funds

It is recommended that this policy is deleted as it is not aligned with IASB. Policy 704.5 Student Activities Fund covers the text that currently resides in 504.9.

710.4 Meal Charges

This policy was reviewed in January 2020, but not included in the Agenda or Minutes. To reiterate, by adding the "Unpaid Student Meals Account" section, the district will be better able to more fairly disperse donations received. More administrative rules need to be established once the policy has been updated.

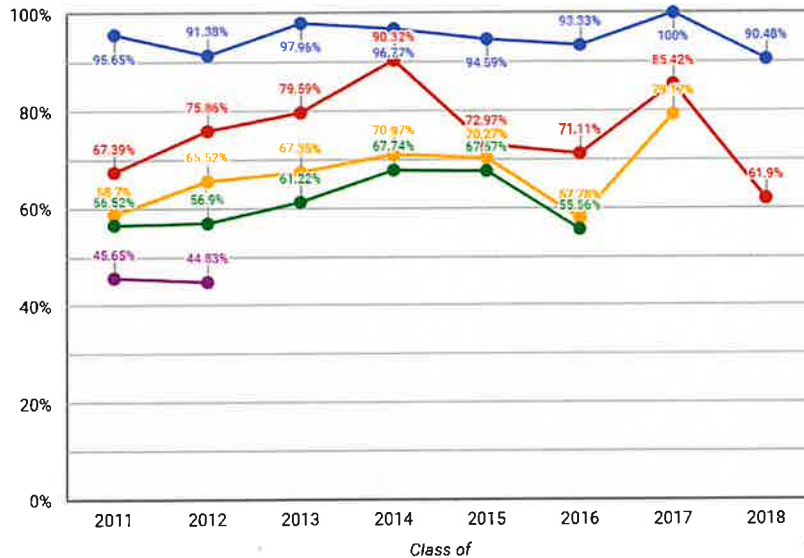
