CENTRAL LYON BOARD MINUTES August 10, 2015

The Central Lyon Board of Directors met in regular session in the Board Room of the Central Lyon Community School at 7:00 P.M. with the following members present: President Steve Sieperda, Vice-President Judy Gacke and Directors David Jans and Chet DeJong, Superintendent Dave Ackerman and Board Secretary Jackie Wells. Middle School Principal/Activities Director Jason Engleman, Emily Deutsch, Stephanie Baker, Tana Meyer, Jessica Jensen, Andy Koob and Lisa Dieren were also present. Director Scott Postma was absent.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 P.M.

DeJong moved to approve the agenda with additional board bills; Jans seconded, carried 4-0.

Gacke moved to approve the minutes from the July 13, 2015 regular meeting; Jans seconded, carried 4-0.

DeJong moved to approve the financial report through 7/31/15 and Jans seconded, carried 4-0.

DeJong moved to approve the summary list of bills; Gacke seconded, carried 4-0.

In recognition, a thank-you note to administration and the district was read from Carson Schubert regarding a recent scholarship and his CUBE experience. Gable Sieperda was recognized for his recent success at the national level. Several baseball players including Nic Lutmer, Riley VanWyhe, Pete Menage, CJ Roths, and Kalen Eckenrod were recognized for their season nominations to all conference, all district and All Northwest Iowa Review baseball teams.

Middle School Principal/Activities Director Jason Engleman reported that Central Lyon coaches, students and fans received a 1.0 (excellent) rating in sportsmanship for the baseball season.

In public participation on non-agenda items, Stephanie Baker requested the board review class size and student needs for the upcoming transitional kindergarten class.

In reports, Lisa Dieren presented the district's insurance coverage summary from EMC Insurance Companies and new procedures for workman's compensation and designated medical treatment. The district saw a premium increase due to variety of factors. The board requested updates on workman's compensation claims throughout the school year.

Superintendent/HS Principal David Ackerman informed the board opening workshop is schedule for August 24 and 25 with a variety of training and meetings for staff. Administration and teachers will continue to review the numbers and student needs in transitional kindergarten as the school year begins. Interviews are being conducted for a Reading Specialist. The construction project continues to stay on schedule with the EL/MS office nearing completion in the next week. Additional changes have been a kitchen office, handicap accessible restroom/changing room, new tile in the high school commons, and updated carpet in the high school.

Geoff Kruse reported on the necessary equipment and future of the Athletic Training Facility. Coaches and administration will continue to analyze the equipment, space and needs of the students and staff. The facility will be more of all-around approach including but not limited to

lifting, fitness, rehabilitation and PE classes. Adminstration and coaches have met to discuss an alumni fundaraiser as an option to fund updates to this facility.

In Old Business, DeJong moved to approve Superintendent's Contract for two years, with a 2015-2016 increase at 1.25% and the 2016-2017 wage to be determined at that time. Gacke seconded, motion failed 2-2.

Jans moved to table the FFA Farm Land Annexation and DeJong seconded, carried 4-0.

In New Business, Jans moved to approve an updated copier agreement and associated terms and DeJong seconded, carried 4-0. Gacke moved to approve the extra-curricular handbook with suggested corrections to language as discussed and Jans seconded, carried 4-0.

In Personnel, Jans moved to approve the resignation of Jason Engleman, Head Baseball Coach and Amanda DeBoer, Paraprofessional and Gacke seconded, carried 4-0. DeJong moved to approve Kathy Van Berkum, Long-Term Substitute and Gacke seconded, carried 4-0.

The first day of school is Wednesday, August 26, 2015. The school board election will be held on Tuesday, September 8, 2015 with polls open from 12:00pm – 8:00pm.

The next regular board meeting will be at 7:00 P.M. on Monday, September 14, 2015 in the Central Lyon board room.

DeJong moved to adjourn at 8:44 P.M. and Jans seconded, carried 4-0.

At a public meeting of the Board of Education, no person shall orally initiate charges or complaints against individual employees of the district or challenge instructional material used in the district. All such charges, complaints, or challenges shall be presented to the superintendent of schools in accordance with established written board policy.

BOARD MEETING PROCEDURES

Welcome to a meeting of the Board of Education of the Central Lyon Community School District, Rock Rapids, Iowa.

The purpose of this brochure is to show you how the Board of Education is structured and how it operates.

Popular control of public education is one of the cornerstones of a free society. The people exercise that control through their Board of Education. To help you take a more active part in its deliberations and operation, the Board has prepared this brochure to explain how you can bring matters of concern to the attention of the Board.

BOARD MEMBERS

The Central Lyon Community School District Board of Education is composed of five citizens elected to serve overlapping terms of four years each. At the end of a term, a board member wishing to continue unsalaried service to the community must be re-elected to an additional four-year term. State law does not limit the number of terms a member may serve. Voting for school board positions takes place on the second Tuesday in September.

BOARD MEETINGS

The Board of Education meets regularly on the second Monday of each month in the board room. Meetings are called to order at 7:00 p.m.

In accordance with the Iowa Code, when it is necessary to hold a meeting at other than the scheduled time, the nature of the meeting shall be stated in the minutes.

Meetings of the Board of Education follow an agenda prepared jointly by the board president and the superintendent of schools. Following the roll call of members, the board proceeds to the agenda items.

The Open Meeting Law requires the posting of the board agenda 24 hours, or more, prior to a scheduled meeting. Topics not included on the agenda may be added only if good cause exists to require expeditious discussion or action on such matters. One of the first items on the agenda is the recognition of any visitors and representatives who may wish to address the board. A visitor who has been granted permission to speak may make a brief statement, express a viewpoint, or ask a question regarding matters related to the school system. It should be pointed out that there is no legal requirement that the public be given this opportunity to speak at board meetings. It is a policy of our board to make this time available to residents of the district. However, a 5 minute time limit per participant will be imposed.

AN ADDITIONAL NOTE: The board's function is to make decisions, and time spent answering routine questions or criticisms

reduces time available for more important board business. If a resident has a question about the operation of the schools, the resident is encouraged to contact the teacher or administrator closest to the situation. Experience has shown that this is the best procedure. The questioner gets the response directly; the board is freed to consider more substantive matters.

Following the "recognition of visitors" portion of the meeting, the board proceeds to the other items on the agenda. These items may include:

Routine business. For efficiency of operation, the board may condense routine business into lists or schedules.

Reports from members of the board, the superintendent of schools, or staff. These reports are usually on matters relevant to the operation of the schools and do not require formal action.

Old business, including updating information on items discussed at previous meetings.

New business.

CLOSED SESSION

The statute provides that all meetings of governmental bodies (including school boards and multi-member bodies created by the boards) shall be open sessions unless a closed session is expressly permitted by law. Further, final action by any governmental body on any matter (whether discussed in open or closed session) must

be taken in open session. A governmental body may hold a closed session only by affirmative public vote of either two-thirds of the members of the body or of all the members present at the meeting. A governmental body may hold a closed session only to the extent a closed session meets the guidelines established by statute.

BOARD ACTION

No one person or group of persons acts in the name of the board. When an item of business comes before the board in the form of a motion, it is necessary that a majority of votes in favor of the motion be cast for the board to

The board has complete and final control over local school matters subject only to limitation imposed by state law, regulation of the state, and the will of local residents as expressed in district elections.

SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

The superintendent of schools is appointed by the Board of Education and acts as its executive officer in administering the board's policies in the operation of the schools. The superintendent also acts as advisor in keeping the board informed of the needs and progress of the schools. The superintendent is available to the board as a professional resource, and the superintendent's recommendations normally precede board action on questions relating to recruitment and supervision of professional staff, selection of textbooks and instructional materials, and development of curriculum.

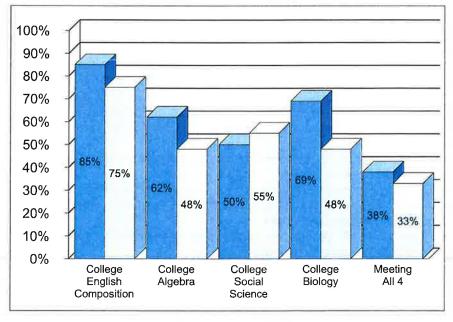

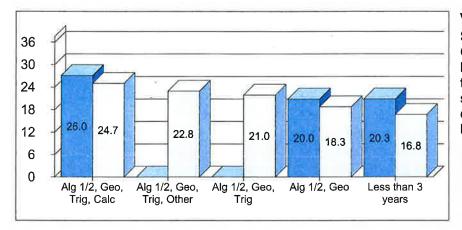

Figure 2. Average ACT Mathematics Scores by Course Sequence

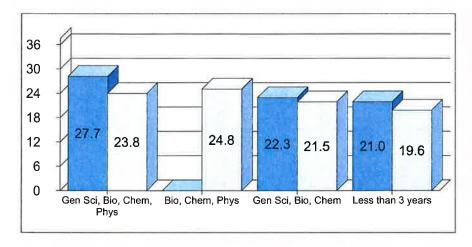

Figure 1 Reading Snapshot: Average NSS by Grade Central Lyon: 2014-2015

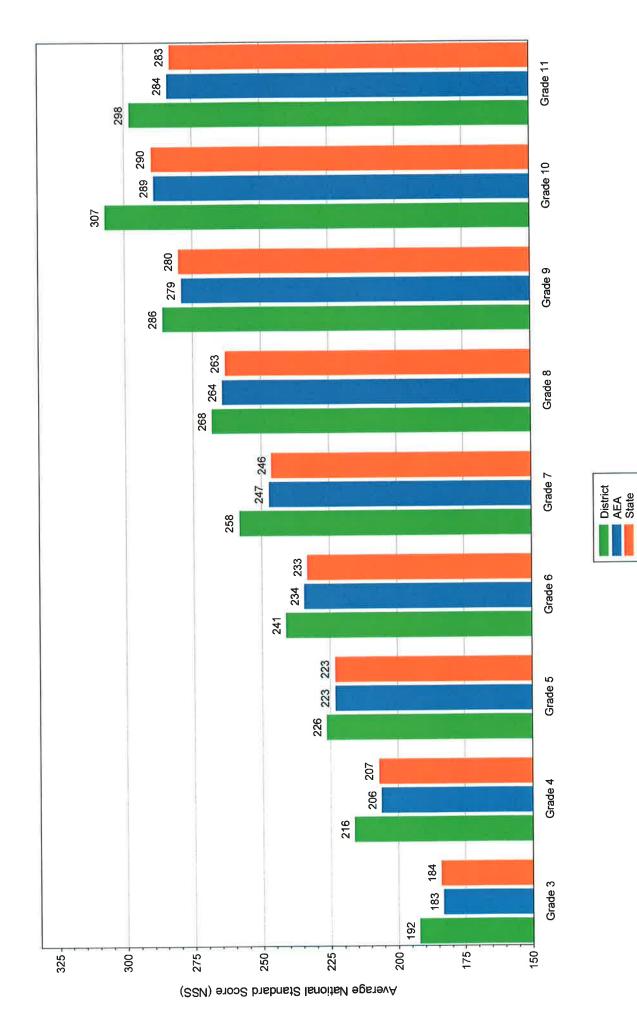
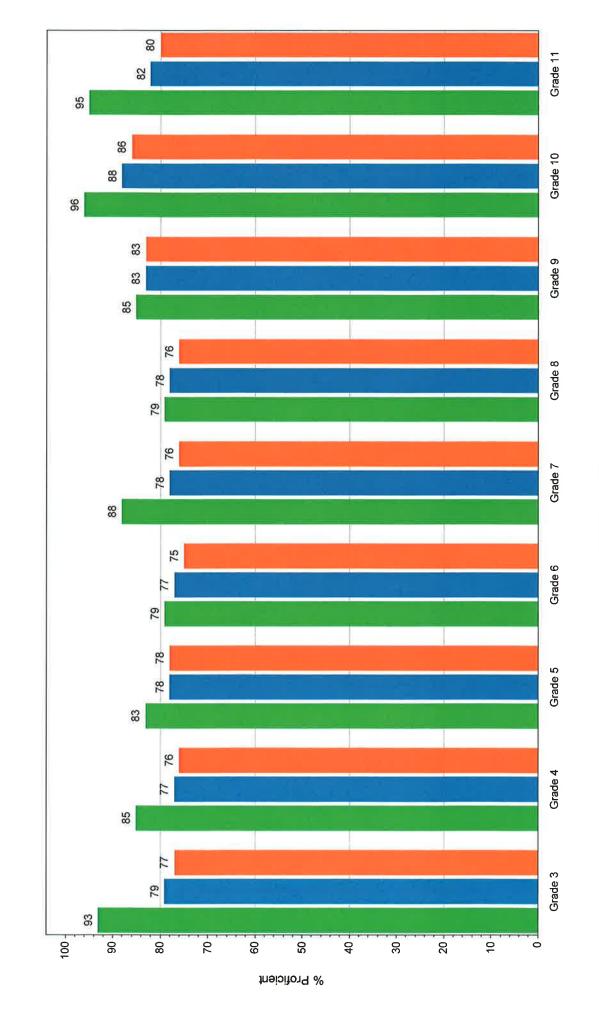

Figure 3 Mathematics Snapshot: Average NSS by Grade Central Lyon: 2014-2015

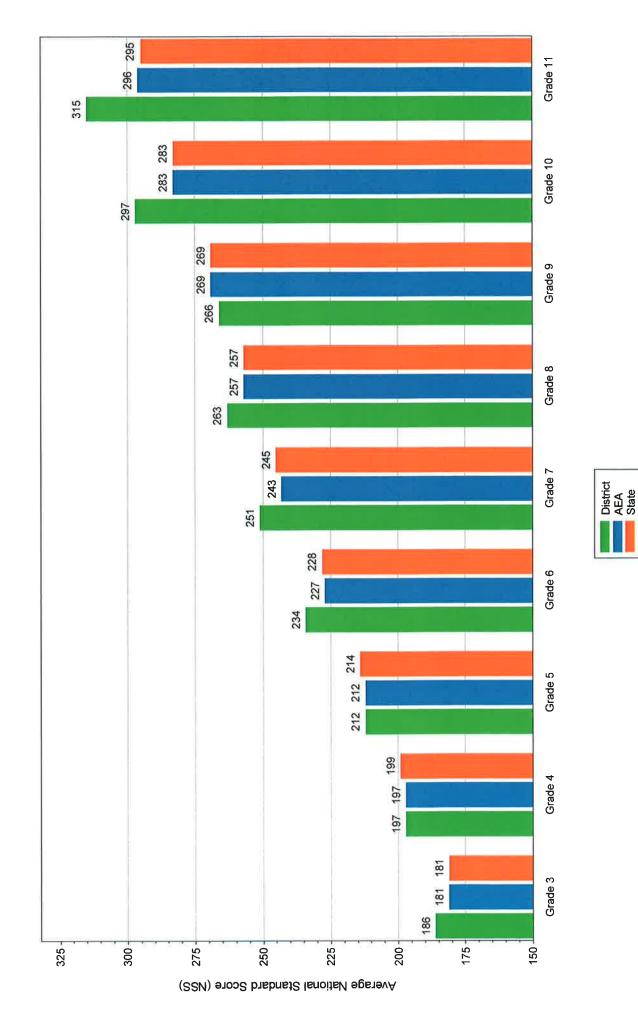
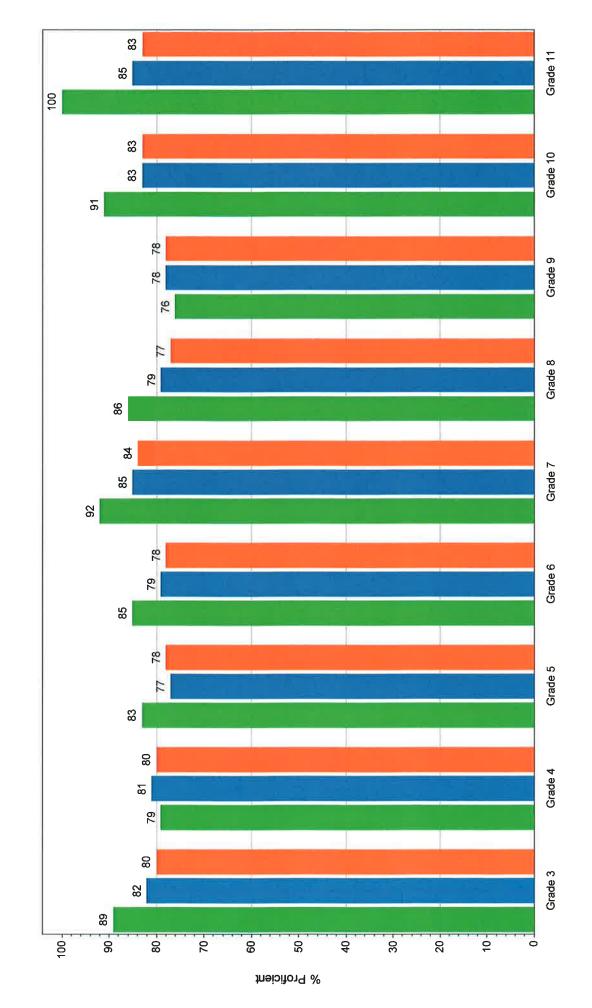
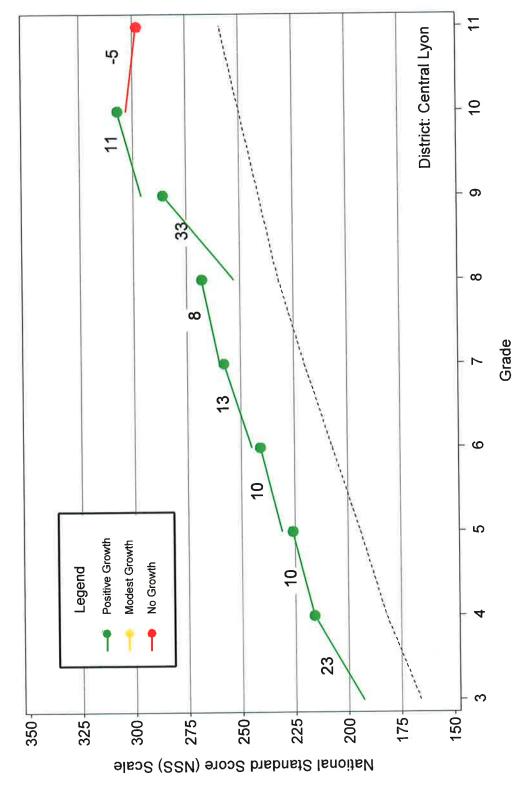

Central Lyon: 2014-2015



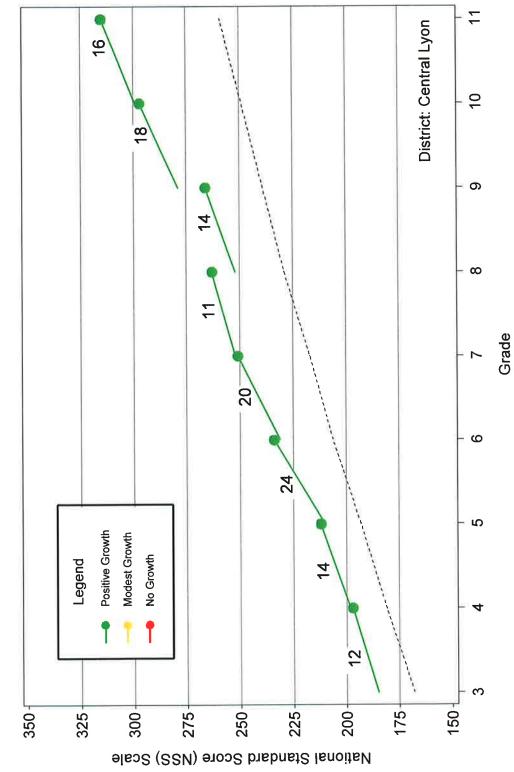

9. Purpose of Request – Description (in detail) of Project. When the project will begin, anticipated completion date, objects/goals of the project, will matching funds be anticipated, if so how will they be raised, etc.

The Central Lyon Community School District is in the process of adding a new addition to the district school building. Included in the new addition is a room that is almost 5800 square feet for weight lifting and exercise equipment that will benefit students in the Central Lyon Community School District. This occupies the second level of the new addition. Physical education classes from 6th grade – 12th grade will hold classes in the new room. The new room is part of the new construction and includes a ½ inch rolled rubber floor.

All funding for equipment in the Athletic Training Center will be privately raised, with no school funds being used. A donor has already given \$100,000 toward this project. We hope to secure \$20,000 from the Forster Foundations have submitted a grant to the Lyon County Riverboat Foundation for \$25,000. The rest will be sought through small private donations. Geoff Kruse is in charge of the fundraiser and 4000 brochures will be sent out requesting funds. Every patron in the district will receive a request as well as 1700 alumni.

It is anticipated that the room and the equipment will be ready by Thanksgiving of 2015. And it is hoped that we can start sending for equipment by October 1 of this year.

The reason the old equipment cannot be moved from its present location is because it is 14 years old and has been well used. (We tried) When a piece is taken apart it cannot be adequately put together again because through use much of the metal has been bent. It can be used if left in its present location, but it cannot be moved with good results.

The new equipment includes nine 8' combo power racks, nine high rotation attachments, nine rack dip attachments, 18 combo power rack band attachments, 18 multi angle dumbbell benches, 16 8' cross brace chinup handles, nine collegiate series DB benches, 27 custom embossed Lion Head covers (at no charge), 6 rotating pad glute ham benches, 4 free standing combo pulleys, 3 pro plated load – 4 way necks, 2 pro plated – seated row, and 1 pro plated load uni-bi-lateral leg press. It also includes three 2 tier "20 pair" modular dumbbell rack, two dual stack functional trainers, two 2-tier medicine ball racks, six adjustable oak plyo boxes and 18 Texas power bars with chrome sleeves. The equipment also includes over 300 black metal plates of various weights, two VTX 8-sided rubber dumbbell sets up to 100 lbs and two VTX 8-sided rubber dumbbell sets up to 50 lbs. The quotation also includes over 100 rubber bumpers and several soft medicine balls. A \$15,564 discount is included in the quote. Freight and installation charges are also included. There is a 10 - 12 week lead-time after receipt of order and 50% is to be paid down. The group already has over 50% of the money raised. The quote is from the Power Lift Company in Jefferson, Iowa and complete details can be found in the attachments.

Although the new equipment will not be available for use by the community, it is anticipated that the former weight room and old equipment will be made available to the Sanford Fitness Center, which is available to community members and will greatly benefit the residents of the area. Since the Sanford Fitness Center and Curves are both available to adults in the community, the new school Athletic Training Center did not want to compete for their business. The first floor of the new addition is also a storm shelter to be used by the community if they are attending an athletic event or by the students for threatening weather during the school day.

We are requesting \$20,000 and would like to have it distributed before October 1. That would ensure that we can order all the equipment at once so that we can get the best deal on shipping and installation. We would also leave the option for the Trust to give \$50,000 and have the naming rights for the room.

WELLNESS POLICY

The board promotes healthy students by supporting wellness, good nutrition and regular physical activity as a part of the total learning environment. The school district supports a healthy environment where students learn and participate in positive dietary and lifestyle practices. The entire school environment, not just the classroom, shall be aligned with healthy school district goals to positively influence a student's understanding, beliefs and habits as they relate to good nutrition and regular physical activity.

The school district supports and promotes proper dietary habits contributing to students' health status and academic performance. Many foods available on school grounds and at school-sponsored activities during the instructional day should meet or exceed the school district nutrition standards. Foods should be served with consideration toward nutritional integrity, variety, appeal, taste, safety and packaging to ensure high-quality meals.

The school district will make every effort to eliminate any social stigma attached to, and prevent the overt identification of, students who are eligible for free and reduced-price meals. Toward this end, the school district may utilize electronic identification and payment system; and promote the availability of meals to all students.

The school district will develop a local wellness policy committee comprised of representatives of the student body, board, parents, leaders in food/exercise authority and employees. The local wellness policy committee will develop a plan to implement and measure the local wellness policy and monitor the effectiveness of the policy. The committee will designate an individual to monitor implementation and evaluation the implementation of the policy.

PHYSICAL ACTIVITY

Daily Physical Education

The school district will provide physical education that:

- is for all students in grades K-12 for the entire school year;
- is taught by a certified physical education teacher;
- includes students with disabilities, students with special health-care needs may be provided in alternative educational settings; and,
- engages students in moderate to vigorous activity during at least 50 percent of physical education class time.

(The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends at least 150 minutes a week for elementary students and 225 minutes a week for middle and high school students);

Daily Recess

Elementary schools should provide recess for students that:

- is at least 20 minutes a day;
